Call to order: 6:10pm

- 1. Welcome and Introductions Attendee introductions:
 - a. Carmen Dones, Ara Aguiar, Lisa Kamibayashi, Carlos Sermeno, Joy Ogami Avila, Joanne Peterson, Erica Johnson, Eric Boghos, Fran Lenard, Amanda De La Vega, Chris Nucho, Allison Oderkerken, Dr. Gary Green, Dr. Ron Mito, Rachel Flynn, Dr. Sandro Tomita, Julie Morrill (Hu-Freidy), Denise Sanchez (MEND)
- 2. WLAC Foundation: Joanne Peterson
 - a. Foundation funding available "wish lists" for funding should be submitted and will be evaluated for approval by the committee.
 - b. The foundation is looking for new ideas or needs
 - c. The foundation is working towards building an infrastructure for a greater presence on campus
 - d. They would like to increase the number of available scholarships and create an alumni association
 - The foundation is requesting any alumni data for contact purposes. Dental hygiene will
 forward their internally collected data to the foundation for the most current email
 addresses
 - e. The foundation is looking for new members (dentists/members of allied health field)
 - f. Two \$4000 scholarships were developed for incoming dental hygiene students to help offset the costs of the instrument kits.
 - g. Aviation has a similar type of scholarship, but geared more towards their exit/licensure exam costs.
- 3. Class of 2013 Student Outcomes and discussion
 - a. Outcome of exams
 - i. 100% pass rate on first attempt for national board exam 2013 and 2014
 - ii. Just over 100 students completed the application entrance essay but only 87 completed applications. 30 students have been accepted for the class of 2016
 - 1. Pasadena only had approx. 30 applications (they take 18 students). Possible rationale for low acceptance rate is due to AA degree requirement change prior to applying to the program.
 - 2. Also more private schools opening up reduce the competition for applicants.
 - b. Review of exit survey (class of 2013)
 - i. 23 students completed the survey
 - ii. One student did not feel confident with referring patients. The student patient tracking sheets will be updated to reflect referrals and class/clinic discussion will be held to provide more referral guidance.

- c. Discussion of minutes/progress from last meeting
 - i. Dr. Green inquired as to why the dental hygiene students are not being rotated through the periodontics department any longer. Connecting with Dr. Klockovold seems to be the barrier. Dr. Green agreed to oversee the students in the perio dept at UCLA on Thursdays if we send two students.
 - ii. Discussed Dental students and DH working together in ATP to develop a treatment plan. Currently, DH students observe but would like to contribute to the DH treatment planning. It was recommended to contact Dr. Camargo to discuss the possibility.

d. WREB UCLA 2014

- i. Wonderful opportunity for the students and much appreciation was given to UCLA and Dr. Camargo for making this happen. The students would have had to travel to Loma Linda or West Coast University to take their exams.
- ii. 2013 1 student took the state and 23 took WREB. 80% passed on the 1st attempt 96% passed with the 2nd attempt. 1 student was unable to retest due to illness. Will re-test with class of 2014 in June.
- iii. 2014 all 19 current students will take the WREB plus the student from last year; 20. Two students are out on illness leave but will return with class of 2016.
- iv. California state board is considering not offering the dental hygiene state board exam any longer. Not cost effective for the amount of work needed to run the exam.
- v. CRDTS Exam is another exam service provider for the clinical exam that is now accepted by California licensing.
- vi. Some talk about moving towards a competency based licensure/licensure by portfolio. The college will be held accountable for the passing of students. It was stated that at this time, West DH program holds the students to a higher standard than the WREB. 3 Mock boards must be passed at a 75% minimum and each tooth is evaluated for calculus, not surfaces as with the WREB.

4. Program Review of 2013

- a. Needs for 2014
 - i. Erika Johnson moved "to hire another full-time faculty member". The motion was passed unanimously.
 - ii. Discussed a dental assisting program to be offered at WLAC as a pathway to Dental Hygiene. The curriculum has gone through the process on campus but not the LAOCRC. Denise from MEND stated that she would like to have DA students rotate through her facility and Dr. Mitos also expressed interest in having students attend UCLA for clinical rotations.

5. CE update

- a. RDHAP-12 students currently enrolled.
- b. Radiology Safety Certificate Course
 - i. Pilot ran last winter. The course consists of 2 weekends with lecture/lab/clinic sessions. Plan to offer these courses during winter and summer sessions
 - ii. Recommendations from the committee members were to increase marketing for the course
 - 1. Contact dental societies, RDA programs who do not offer the radiology licensure, ROP programs/SCROC.
 - iii. Challenges to enrollment success with the program are that there are many online programs available
- c. Others

- i. Infection control, Coronal polishing and Pit and Fissure Sealant placement CE's have been developed and submitted to the board in November of 2013. The courses are currently pending approval from the board. The board has undergone some infrastructure changes, so the process is taking longer than normal.
- ii. RDAEF: was discussed but unable to do since a dentist needs to prep teeth.
- 6. Clinic opening update
 - a. Legal council is coming May 27th to do a walk through.
 - b. A push from the student body is helping to move the process forward
- 7. Baccalaureate in Dental Hygiene: SB 850
 - a. WLAC has an opportunity to offer a bachelors degree in dental hygiene at community college level
 - b. Requires a high unit program with no UC/CSU transferability
 - c. Ara suggested teaching, research and public health as potential uses for a student with a B.S. in dental hygiene
 - d. Carmen is requesting letters of support from the advisory board and industry leaders
 - e. Advisory board members expressed concerns with program logistics as far as when students would be asked to complete the additional courses (potentially 3 courses English 103, a high level research course and Math/Statistics), how many additional courses the degree would require, what the cost impact would be on students and financial aid qualification, and if the degree would be optional?
 - f. The advisory board requested a proposal of the program and survey data of from current students indicating the levels of interested in the potential to earn a B.S. degree.
- 8. Inter-professional Education (IPE)
 - a. There is a national push for bringing professional groups together to work together as a part of the educational process.
 - i. One Health
 - b. UCLA currently offers a case management course that requires medical, dental and nursing students to work together.
 - c. A recommendation to look into integrating dental hygiene into this type of rotation was stated by the board. Denise from MEND offered to allow students to rotate through MEND's medical. Also mentioned was Airport Marina Counseling Service.








How are you connected to the Dental Hygiene program at West LA College as an advisory board member?
