### ANATOMY 001 - INTRODUCTION TO HUMAN ANATOMY (UC/CSU) - 4 UNITS

Requirement Designation: Meets IGETC 5B or 5C and CSU B2 or B3  
Enrollment Requirement: Placement or Complete ANATOMY 001 or Biology 003A AND Biology 003B OR Biology 003

PREREQUISITES: Biology 3A and Biology 3B (or equivalent) with a grade of 'C' or better. RECOMMENDED: English 28, Math 115. NOTE: Lecture - 3 hours, Laboratory - 3 hours. DESCRIPTION: This course presents the structure of the human body by subdividing it into individual body systems. It is intended to meet the requirements for students entering Nursing, Dental Hygiene or Occupational Therapy; and for students majoring in Physical Education.

### ANTHRO 101 - HUMAN BIOLOGICAL EVOLUTION (UC/CSU) - 3 UNITS

Requirement Designation: Meets IGETC 5B and CSU B2

NOTE: This course satisfies Area 5 (Physical & Biological Sciences) requirements for the IGETC. DESCRIPTION: Anthropology 101 presents the scientific approach in unraveling the mystery of the evolution of humankind through investigation of human fossil remains (e.g. the 3.5 million-year-old footprints and the 'Lucy' skeleton of East Africa), making use of recent DNA research -- much of it coming out of the Human Genome Project -- and by looking at studies of monkeys and apes so we can better assess our relationship to the other primates. The course examines the dynamic relationship between humans and their environment, and explores scientific explanations for human variation.
