

CAOT-39 Word Processing – Keyboarding & Operations - WordPerfect

This course presents Word Processing using WordPerfect. It presumes computer familiarity and ability to type 20 wpm. Students must arrange for 2 added hours per week in the lab.

Objectives: As a result of completing this course successfully, the student will be able to:

1. Use WordPerfect terminology accurately.
2. Use computer systems, including a printer, in order to create, save, print, and manage files.
3. Recall, edit, and perfect documents.
4. Perform selected advanced functions such as form letters and mail merge.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student should be able to identify the appropriate document formatting and activity and prepare accurate documentation to satisfy particular job or business requirements. The culminating activity includes a comprehensive objective measure and a practical evaluation performed on a computer. The practical requires the student to use the currently assigned software to prepare an advanced procedure such as: performing a merge activity based on a document to be formatted according to a traditional layout, content, and recipient's list provided by the instructor. The entire practical activity is timed.

A successful pursuit of the many topics in this subject requires:

1. Regular and on-time attendance in class. Absences over 3 hours may result in exclusion or a grading penalty. Being tardy, or leaving class early, three times count as an absence. It is the student's responsibility to drop any class they wish to terminate.
2. Preparation for class and lab by studying the written materials. These include the texts, handouts, and the student's own lecture notes.
3. Regular computer lab activities using the applications programs. Several hours each week, at the student's convenience, are appropriate. This includes 2 hours in the college lab in addition to the scheduled class meeting time. Selected exercises are to be submitted as hard copy for credit.

The required materials for this class include:

1. *WordPerfect 9. Complete Tutorial*, Eisch, South-Western Publishing, ISBN 0-538-69247-2. (Rentable from college bookstore for \$44.)
2. (1) Flash drive. Any capacity. (Only this class files to go on this drive.)
3. (6) narrow Scantron scoring sheets & a #2 pencil with eraser.

Grading will be based on the following: quizzes, a mid-term, specifically assigned lab exercises, the final exam, and attendance and participation. Each category counts 20%.

Please consult the college catalog, student handbook, & schedule of classes for college rules & pertinent dates. The last date to drop any class is printed in the schedule. Unavoidable absences should be discussed with the instructor, preferably in advance. Notes & assignments, missed due to absence, should be obtained from another student. Make-up exams/quizzes are not provided for. -Completed exams will be discussed only during the class time when the results are announced. It is in your interest to keep track of your grades & absences. Children are not permitted in class. Recording devices, beepers/pagers & other personal electronic devices should be turned off. Cell phones should be turned off & no cell conversations are permitted in class or labs. Final exams must be taken at the time scheduled. Please have reference materials (note, handouts, lab text) when in the lab. Please read & observe all the lab rules which are designed to benefit all students.

All work for credit, either written or produced on the computer, must be your own. Students, of course, may work together while learning on the computer. **Save only this class's work on the flash drive & save with file names specified in the texts or by the instructor.**

Incomplete grades are reserved for physical inability to perform the final exam (such as sudden hospitalization) and also $\frac{3}{4}$ of the semester's class work must have been completed.
