



ACT: Accelerated College Transfer

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q- What is ACT?

A- This is an Accelerated College Transfer program. It is a system designed for evening students that may have a day schedule, which may conflict with attending school during the day.

Q- How long is this program?

A- Each class are 8 week sessions (2 Nights + 4 Saturdays, year round), and as a student you're able to graduate in two years or less.

Q- How steps do I need to do to become a part ACT?

A- Attend an ACT Orientation (HLRC a.k.a. Library 4th Fl.)
Submit an "Application for Admission" to the college (Online or A-13) 310-287-4501
Take the College Assessment Test (A12-100) 310-287-4462
See a College Counselor (A-13) 310-287-4399 Or 4257

Q- Where can I view my selections of courses?

A- You can view ACT classes in the ACT sections (Evening) p. 83 in the Class Schedule or on the WLAC website.

Q- Can I still take other classes while being in the Program?

A- Definitely, students may combine evening ACT classes with regular classes when there are no scheduling conflicts.

Q- Can I enroll in the Program at any time or semester?

A-Yes, but you may want to give yourself enough time that way you're ready for the new session.

Q- How many sessions are there?

A- Two 8 week sessions in a semester, this allows you to choose either one or both.

Q- Would I be able to earn a degree while being in ACT?

A- The ACT format and curriculum fulfill the general education requirements for both transfer and the AA degree.

Q- What is ACT Bridge Options?

A- It is designed to help our students meet the prerequisites for the transferable courses in English and Math only. There are no other prereq's for any other ACT courses.

Q- Does ACT Bridge take place as the same time the ACT Program classes are?

A- Not at all. Bridge classes are scheduled on either One evening, Tu Th or MW. This scheduling gives ACT students the opportunity to take the Bridge and ACT classes concurrently.

Q- Is Bridge a short session as ACT?

A- Bridge courses are 16 week classes
