TRANSFERRING TO HAMPTON UNIVERSITY

Ken Overstreet #7 DB (Locke HS) led the conference in interceptions, and was second in the state for passes picked-off. He was named first team All-Conference in the American Pacific division. *“Ken is a big hitter! He proved to be our most consistent player on defense. Also, he has made great strides in the classroom to become a successful student-athlete”.* WLAC Coach Miller



TRANSFERRING TO SOUTHEAST MISSOURI STATE

Aaron Grimes #6 DB (University HS) was selected All-Conference and recorded 41 solo tackles, 8 assisted tackles, 4 interceptions, 2 passes defended, and 2 fumble recoveries. *“Aaron was a true leader for our team leading by example as well as, his locker room presence”*, says Coach Miller.



TRANSFERRING TO NORTH DAKOTA STATE

Sam Rogers #80 WR (Hamilton HS) started the season scoring a touchdown either by a reception, rushing, or kick-off return in the first five games he played in this season. Sam’s dad is former WLAC alum before becoming a ten-year NFL veteran. *“Sammie is a very hard-nosed player that gives 100% effort on the field and the classroom”.* WLAC Coach Miller



TRANSFERRING TO UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA-MOORHEAD

Terrell Crawford #66 OL (LA Jordan HS) was selected All-Conference after blocking for an offensive unit which led the conference in scoring, first downs, red zone efficiency, third down conversions, and the least amount of sacks allowed. *“Terrell is a kid that everyone roots for, and I envision great things for him in the future”*, says Coach Miller.



TRANSFERRING TO MILES COLLEGE

Arman Wright #37 DL (St. Bernard’s HS) finished the 2008 season with 24 solo tackles, 9 assisted tackles, 2 tackles for loss, and one fumble recovery. Arman graduated in three semesters with a 3.0 GPA and an Associates Arts degree. *“Arman is a perfect example of a student-athlete. He is dedicated in the classroom as well as, on the field”*, says Coach Miller.



TRANSFERRING TO HENDERSON STATE

Gene Carter #36 DB (Horn HS) played both strong safety and outside linebacker for the Wildcats during the 2008 season. Gene recorded 44 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, 1 sack, five pass break-ups, and two fumble recoveries. *"Gene is a versatile defender and has the ability to play both safety and linebacker at the next level", says Coach Miller.*



TRANSFERRING TO NEW MEXICO HIGHLANDS UNIVERSITY

Monroe Ross #1 WR (Leuzinger HS) enrolled at New Mexico Highlands in January in time to begin the spring semester. Due to injuries, he was limited to 10 receptions on the season in 2008. Also, he was a contributor on special teams after transferring from another junior college where he recorded 50 receptions and 8 touchdowns as a freshman. *"Monroe has a lot of potential, and he will be a great benefit to a team at the collegiate level", says Coach Miller.*



TRANSFERRING TO TUSCULUM COLLEGE

Rayvin Smith #21 DB (Jefferson HS) started all ten games in the 2008 season recording 38 tackles, 1 interception, and a touchdown. *"Rayvin was a leader on our team with his maturity and great work ethic. His coverage skills made him a top recruit with many of the colleges seeking his services", says Coach Miller.*



TRANSFERRING TO WHITTIER COLLEGE

Matt Evans #16 QB (Antelope Valley HS) has been accepted into Whittier College and plans to enroll for the fall semester to continue his academic and athletic career. Matt started the season as a back-up but, made the most of his opportunity leading the Wildcats to their first conference victory in a 50-37 victory over Pierce College. On the day he had 14 completions, 19 attempts, 200 yards and 4 touchdowns. Matt finished the semester with a 3.7 grade point average. *"Matt is what athletics is all about; attitude. When he got his opportunity he was ready"! WLAC Coach Miller*



TRANSFERRING TO TABOR COLLEGE

Dayvon Sinclair #11 LB (Jefferson HS) started all ten games for the Wildcats in 2008. He recorded 46 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, 1 sack, 1 pass break-up, and 1 fumble recovery. *"Sinclair gave our program 110% of effort and we are very grateful to have had him play for us", says Coach Miller.*



TRANSFERRING TO TABOR COLLEGE

Joaquin Haywood #33 RB (Washington HS) contributed as a role player and valuable special team's performer. He finished the season with 20 carries, 104 yards. *"Joaquin got a late start on our season while waiting to be cleared to play. But, his maturity helped him contribute to our team", says Coach Miller.*



TRANSFERRING TO MOREHOUSE COLLEGE

Raymond Elie #4 WR (Palisades HS) was a second team All-Conference performer in the all-purpose category. He finished with 49 receptions, 20 carries for 150 yards, 15 punt returns for 128 yards, 20 kick-off returns for 333 yards, and he threw two touchdown passes on the season. *"Raymond was the most versatile player on our team. We used him every way possible". WLAC coach Miller*
