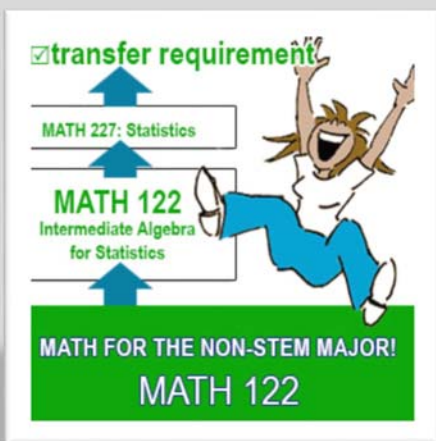

MATH 122: INTERMEDIATE ALGEBRA FOR STATISTICS

This course is an alternative to Math 125 for students who plan to take Math 227 (Statistics) to fulfill their transfer-level Mathematics requirement. The course content and level are comparable to Math 125, with Statistics-related units replacing several traditional Intermediate Algebra topics.

Successful completion of Math 122 allows students to enroll in Math 227 (Statistics), Math 215 (Mathematics for Elementary School Teachers) or Math 240 (College Algebra). It does NOT serve as a pre-requisite for any other 200-level math class.

*NOTE: Students who plan to major in a STEM field or any other subject requiring Calculus or Trigonometry should **NOT** enroll in Math 122.*
