WLAC Welcomes New Winning Head Football Coach

West Los Angeles College welcomes a new head coach, Marguet Miller, who begins immediately. Coach Miller was a defensive end in the NFL Europe before entering coaching. Prior to joining West, the coach was the offensive coordinator at Pasadena City College. In 2007, their offense led the nation in total yards per game and broke the Mission Conference record for total offense. In 20 games as the offensive coordinator, his offenses averaged 35 points per game. He also coached the team's quarterback who became the state leader in passing for two consecutive years and the national passing leader in 2007.

Prior to Pasadena, Coach Miller worked at Mt. San Antonio College where helped the team win the 1997 national championship as wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator. He coached three JC All-Americans during his tenure there. At East Los Angeles College, the coach led the team to their first bowl appearance in 26 years in 2000, leading the conference in total offense and points.

"Coach Miller has a proven background of success at the community college level particularly on the offensive side of the ball. We know that his high powered spread offense will be fun to play and will enhance our recruiting abilities because of the style of play. We also believe that it will be fun for our fans to watch and exciting for everyone," said Steve Aggers, WLAC Athletic Director.

In addition to his success on the field, Coach Miller is an educator with a Bachelors degree from the University of Nevada – Las Vegas and a Masters degree from Cal State Dominquez Hills.

Said Aggers, "We were impressed with his dedication to student-athletes and their academic performance first and foremost. He and his staff will conduct themselves with the welfare of our students upper most in their minds."

West Los Angeles College, a community college located just east of Sepulveda and Jefferson, has been providing excellent university transfer and career training programs to the community for nearly 40 years.
