Carpool:



A carpool is made up of two or more people sharing the ride to work. Carpools can be as flexible as you need them to be. Share the ride every day, or once a week. It is up to you. But remember, the more you share, the more you save!

Carpooling vs. Driving Alone:

According to the American Automobile Association's (AAA) 2011 Edition of Your Driving Costs, the average cost of owning and operating a medium sedan in 2011 is 57.3 cents per mile, or \$8,588 per year based on 15,000 miles of driving.
